

In the afternoon of the 5th May the wider school community were invited into school to join us to celebrate King Charles III Coronation.

The KS2 children performed their dances to everyone. The school council designed a game for the whole school to pin the crown on King Charles III and FONS served refreshments. The parents had the opportunity to look at an exhibition of the children's art form the learning power character designs and also their models of the coronation coach. During the assembly the children sang a Coronation Song and children won prizes for the best decorated crown and for pinning the crown on King Charles III. The children were given a commemorative medal by St Matthews church Worthington and also a teddy by FONS.

Ashby Castle

On May 17th reception visited Ashby castle as part of their theme.

Our visit to Ashby castle was a really fun afternoon and allowed us to see all the information the children had learnt about life in a castle. Dressed in our costumes we worked as servants in the kitchen, told our jokes in the banqueting hall and climbed to the top of the tower counting the 98 steps!









At the beginning of the term, KS2 were treated to a visit form a Roman Centurion. We spent the day learning about life as a Roman Centurion and how they used their shields, spears, cooking equipment and so on. We practiced marching in a turtle formation – it wasn't easy! We learnt about Gladiator fighting – we even perfected the use of a spear and a net! We learnt how to play some Roman games – Ludus and knuckles; we explored Roman pottery; dressed as a Roman and learnt how to write as they did. We ended the day with a transfixing story about Ulysses and the Cyclops. What a great way to start our Roman topic!



KS2 Summer 1

Science

In science, KS2 have been learning all about the structure of plants – we are growing our own tomatoes at school! We have learnt about the different parts of a plant, and their functions – carrying out a few demonstrations to understand more. Each child has been invited to take part in a sunflower growing competition. Those who chose to take part have taken their planted seeds home. They will use their knowledge of what a plant needs to grow the tallest flower they can. It will be interesting to see how tall they grow, as this variety can reach up to 4m in height!

KS2 Summer 2

KS2

Swans have developed their learning of the Roman Empire, learning about why the Empire expanded to Britain. We have learnt about how Boudicca fought against the Romans and why Hadrian's Wall was built.

We have developed our understanding of light, shadows and reflective materials. We have learnt about how important it is to protect ourselves from the harmful Ultra-Violet rays of the sun.

In art, Swans have been learning about using mosaics to make patterns and pictures, as the Romans used. We used small pieces of coloured glass to make our own artwork.

In English, Swans have been writing a suspense story. In order to write the best story, we can, we have learnt a model text and used this structure to plan our own story. It has taken a lot of planning, but we have some great elements in our writing.

Swans enjoyed taking part in a French day the children tasted French food - croissants, pan au chocolat, baguette, brie, crepes and drank jus d'orange or chocolat chaud. All greeted the cafe owners (Mrs Weston and Mrs Hansard!) with Bonjour, and used s'il vous plait, merci, and au revoir and asked for the foods in French.

They then undertook a variety of activities including finding out about the geography and famous landmarks and landscapes in France. Designing their own French menu and learning colours, finding out more about the artist Claude Monet.







KS1 Summer 1

Robins

During summer half term, Reception have been looking at the theme of storytelling. We have listened to different traditional stories which have the setting of a castle and enjoyed dressing up as knights and imaging the adventures we can go on in the role play area. The children have used the small world figures to make up stories involving castles and knights and dragons and drawn their stories using story maps before writing them. The children enjoyed making castles from junk and a range of different construction materials and were challenged to add moving parts like drawbridges to their models. As part of the story of Jack and the Beanstalk we found out how we can use maps.

The whole class have been exploring sound this half term in music and we even learnt to say a rap with a dance to go with it. Great fun, but probably not the best moves! In PE we have been working on our skills to make us good team members and it has been good to see the progress the children have made since the start of term, ensuring they listen to each other's ideas as the work together. In PSHE we have been thinking about different aspects of keeping safe including road safety and knowing when we can say no to others. During Cooper's Cutting time the class have been planting seeds and bulbs out in the spaces around the school and taking care of them. In RE we have explored the Christian story of creation and why people feel that we should take care of the world in which we live.

Year 1 and 2 have continued to explore plants and the conditions that they need to grow this term and hopefully can now name many different plants they have seen growing. We have been working on writing texts about habitats and so have explored the different habitats that animals live in. We had fun thinking of animals to put into the wrong habitat. For example, a polar bear in the desert.



We listened to many, many Julia Donaldson stories and learnt about her as an author. We have been exploring maps and the symbols used on a key as part of our work on learning about Newbold. We will continue this work after half term by exploring the map of the mine buildings in the Lount Nature Reserve. We hopefully can now all say our address or at least some of it now.



KS1 Summer 2

During this half term reception have been working on the theme of the seaside. They talked about the setting for the story of Grandad's Island and compared fiction and non-fiction books about whales. During the last few weeks they have thought about what kind of holidays they would have in different climates like Antarctica or on a beach in the UK. They all enjoyed making their lighthouses and trying to make them light up using an electric circuit. And of course, their teddy bears picnic was a lot of fun.

Year One and Two have been finding out about Brazil and some of the place that tourists would visit. We enjoyed learning some Portuguese and finding out about the Rio Carnival. As part of our work on climate and habitats we have been learning about the rainforest and the many different



animals that live there. We have been very grateful to Mrs Mack for coming into school and helping us to sew our rainforest animal designs. We particularly enjoyed finding out about the street artist James Rizzi and the children worked really hard and produced amazing pictures using the same styles.





In RE we have been exploring what different religious and non-religious people think about caring for the world we live in and what we can do to care for the world too. As we reach the end of the year Robins have been using the maths they have learnt to think about patterns in number and



filling in any gaps in their knowledge. Year One and Two have been working on telling the time which can be a difficult concept.

Our plants have been growing well around the school grounds and we have managed to find evidence that summer has arrived. We have also carried out investigations to explore which are the best objects in Cooper's cutting to make the loudest sounds in our instruments and also which objects float or sink.





Calke Abbey

On 9th June the whole school went on a visit to Calke Abbey. KS2 visited the house and worked on their map skills by taking part in an orienteering activity. KS1 worked spent time exploring the plants including the fruit and vegetables.



Miss Woodhouse has now finished her teacher practice with us. We wish her all the best for the future.






On 4th July the year 6 leavers and staff had a fun evening out at the mini golf in Loughborough.




Spirited Arts Competition





Darcey and Katy then wrote an explanation for the artwork which we are going to submit for the competition.









































Our Marvellous Living Earth; Broken Yet Hopeful

The inspiration for our artwork started by visiting Lount Nature Reserve to look at how the nature has taken over the old coal mine buildings that were there. Before it closed, it was not a pretty area but now it is full of plants and trees. It is beautiful. The pupils at our school like to go there to learn, walk their dogs, cycle, horse ride or run circuits. To enjoy the peace and quiet.

The younger children in our school explored 'Our Marvellous Earth' by observing nature up close to see the beautiful sights that God has created for us to live in and admire. God made this earth so we should keep it how He wanted it to be. The older children decided to look at where the old parts of the coal mine were now covered by delightful nature making it a place that we now relax in. This shows that although the world may have been damaged and broken by pollution, through fossil fuels and litter, we can make a change and repair the damage we have done. We caused it but we can also fix it and try to make God's creation how He thought it should be.

We took this idea of making the world a better place by restoring its magnificence to create our art pieces and we have put them together with the close-up drawings of the nature we found there. We added words to our designs to express how we feel about the world. We have printed our designs onto acetate, leaving the white parts to make clear space allowing the light to shine through when it is displayed on a window as if it is alive.
