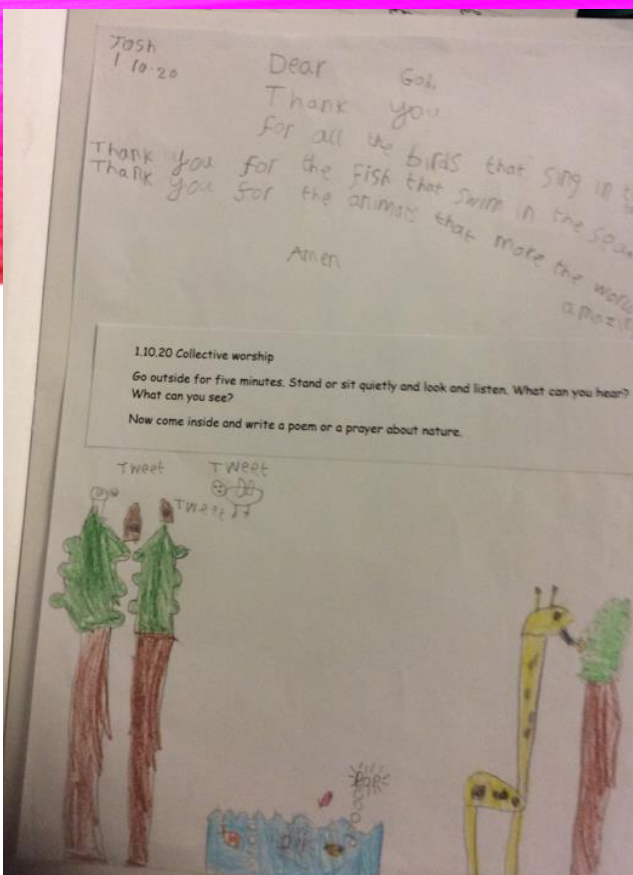

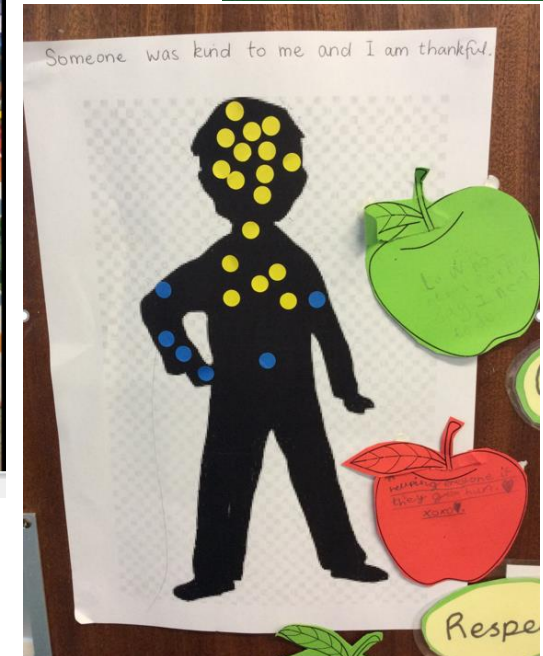

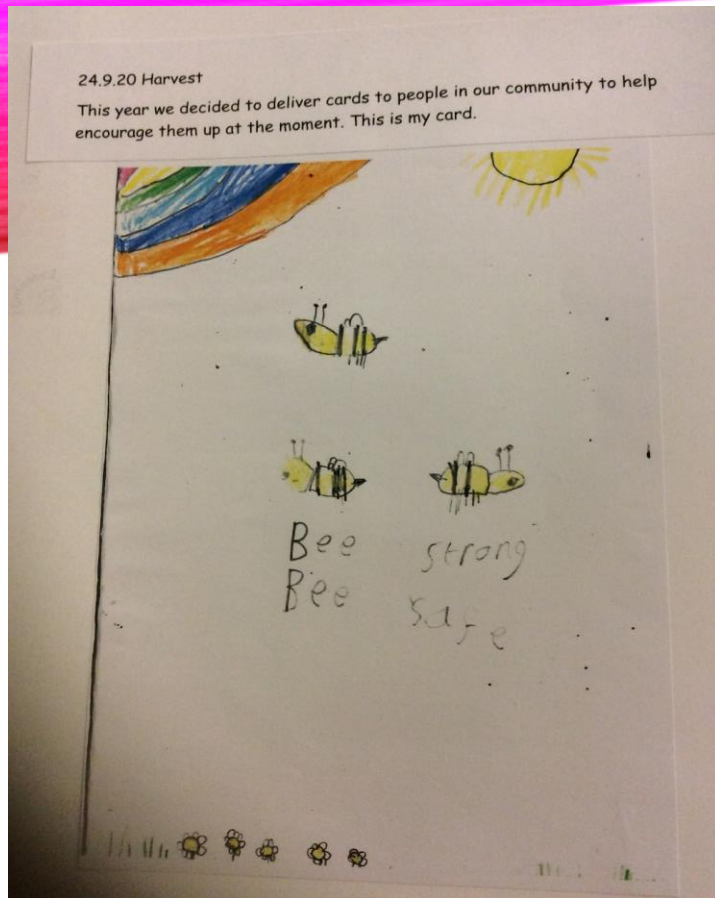
Autumn 1 Value- Generosity

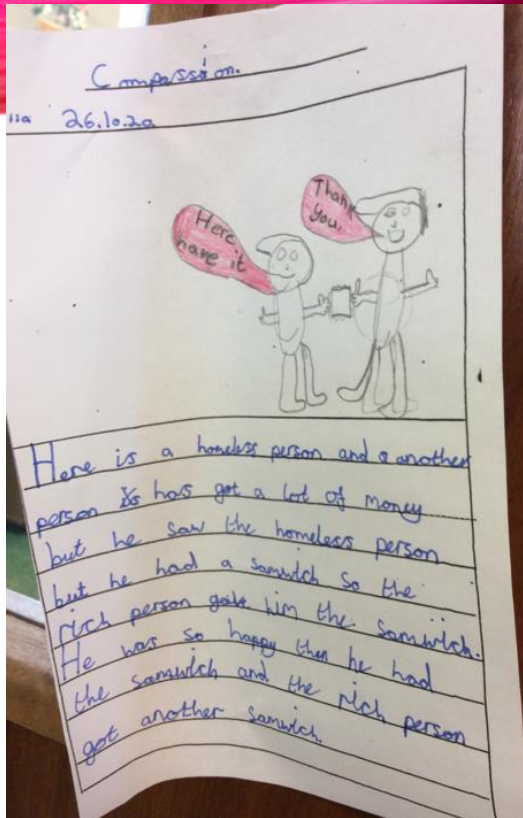
Thank you to everyone who donated to the Foodbank this week to help us celebrate harvest.

Autumn 2 Value- Compassion

Each class rewrote their class prayer together at the start of term. We are all invited to say Grace and an end of day prayer together each day.



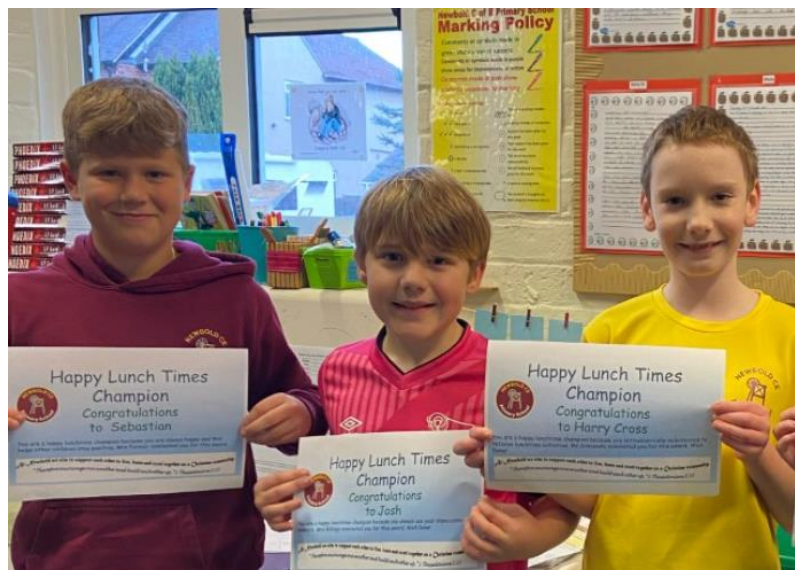
Values Tree

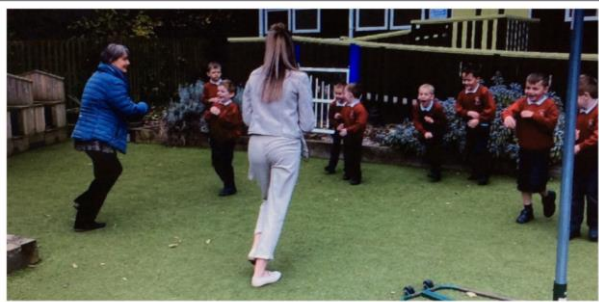


Happy Lunchtimes

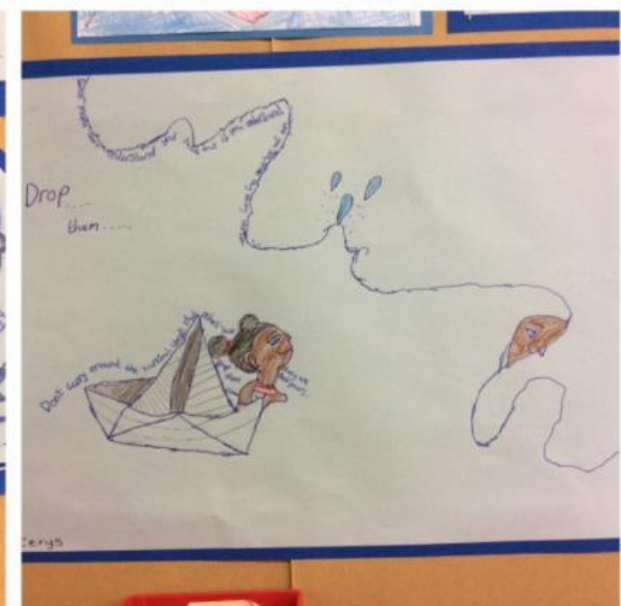
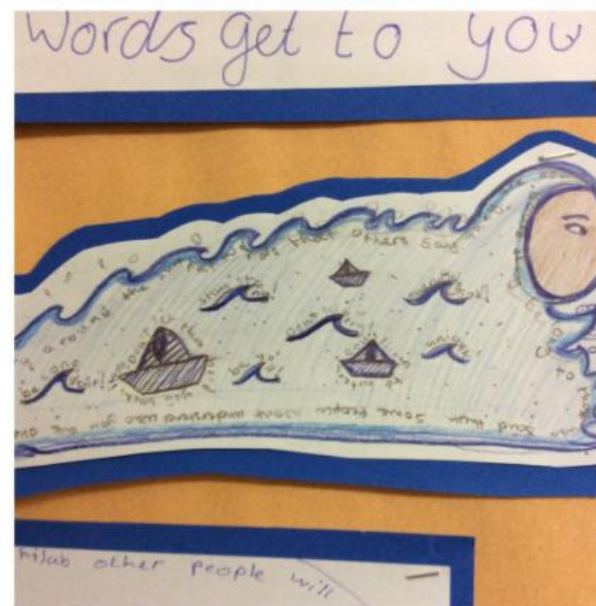


Ms Hitchman has also been working on our anti-bullying award and on rewriting our antibullying policy.

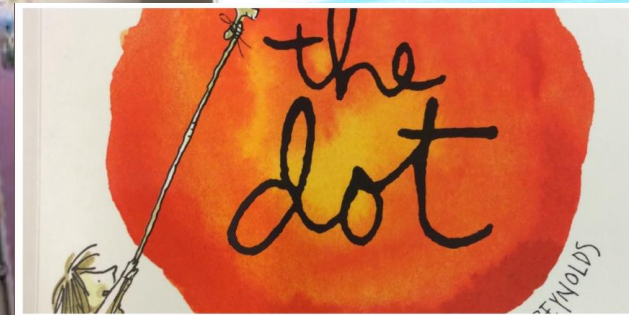

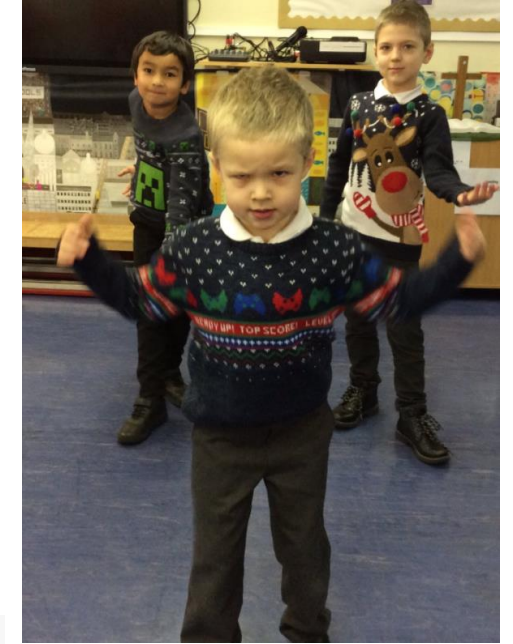
Owls enjoying listening to African stories and joining in with some African dance.

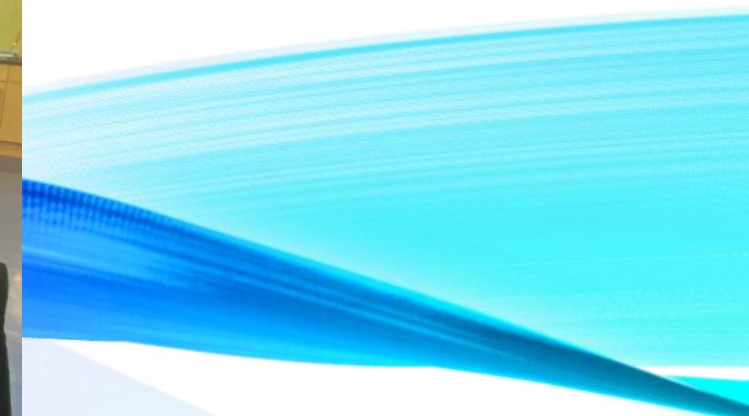


CLASS CHRISTMAS PARTIES
