

History Workshop- Mining in Leicestershire

We had a fantastic morning learning all about the local coal mining industry. We used photographs and voice recordings to put ourselves in the role of miners and their families. Using a variety of drama techniques (freeze frames, live action and conscience alley) we explored what life was like for the young miners. It has really inspired us to learn more about the local area - we will be taking this up in our History topic after half term.



On Monday a couple of weeks ago the years 2-6 had a History Morning. The Man's name that did it was Mike and it was about the mines 150 years ago.

We started by 'going back into time' and then we were pretending that we were someone from the mines and talking to each other about what we thought it would be like in the Mines 150 years ago.

We then did some freeze frames and we also got into groups so that there was someone from each year in each group (if it was possible) and we did some drama acts and once we had done that we shared them with all of the other groups and the teachers that were in the room which were Mrs. Hansard, Mrs. Issitt, Ms. Hitchman, Mrs. Granger and Mike who was the person that was teaching us about the Mines.

We then stood in a line with a few people slumped up I a group and we were pretending that they were in a cage with Arthurs dad at the front of the clump so that someone that we called Arthur could walk slowly walked down the line and the people that were in the line were shouting things out that they thought Arthur would be thinking as it was his first time going down the mine with his Dad.

Lastly we got into partners and one person was guiding the other person around and when the leader said UP the follower would have to list their leg up and then DOWN meant to duck. The leader was Arthurs Dad and the reason why was because the Mines were very dark and his Dad knew the Mines very well as he had been down the mines for around 12 hours a day for the past 6 years. We also went through a PowerPoint at the end and never 'came back' into 2022 again.
