
Owls worked on 'What can we learn from religions about right and wrong?' in the first half term and Anti-racist RE in the second.

Eagles worked on Kingdom of God in the first term and Anti-racist RE in the second.












Spirited Arts Competition 2021 - Eagles


The first lesson in unit of work allowed the classes to discuss six different racist scenarios and decide what they thought was bad about each situation. The children brought to the discussion their knowledge from previous discussion they have had about the 'Black Lives Matter' movement and Rosa Parks and Martin Luther Kings. This helped them to be able to put forward a clear point of view during their thoughtful discussions.

My picture looks like a face with different skin tones, different eye colours to show that everyone's different.




The Rainbow of Differences



We were not able to have our usual sports day as a whole school but each class had a good time carrying out their sports day challenge. The scores were added up for each house and fire were the winners overall.








Twycross Zoo
